

Entry Deadline: May 31, 5 pm CDT **Registration Opens:** February 28, 9 am CST

Before submitting your entry, please be sure to review the <u>Competition Overview post on Cookie Connection</u> for general rules that apply to both 2-D and 3-D cookies, and remind yourself of the 3-D Cookie definition and theme, below. Then read on for the specific submission materials for this category. It's best to have these required materials organized and all in one place before you start the upload process to *Cookie Connection*, as everything must be uploaded in one session. (If you should have internet troubles and lose your connection mid-entering, no worries. Just start the upload process again. However, once you hit "Publish", you cannot alter your entry.) Again, a link to upload your required materials will automatically be sent to you after you've paid the non-refundable \$15 USD entry fee and filled out the competition registration form on Eventbrite. **To register, simply click on one of the big teal "REGISTER HERE" links in this document to be taken to Eventbrite.**

Important: Record the name, email address, and phone number that you use to register on Eventbrite; you must use the exact same ones on your entry form on *Cookie Connection* so that we know you have paid a registration fee. Entries without paid registration fees will be eliminated.

3-D Cookie Definition

A multi-cookie construction, where decorated cookies are arranged in any orientation and pieced together to create a freestanding, dimensional piece of cookie art. A minimum of 12 decorated cookies must comprise this construction; there is no maximum cookie count. The cookies in the entry needn't be flat; they can also be contoured, embossed, molded, modeled, sculpted, or otherwise shaped. The entire entry must fit into a 2 x 2 x 3-foot-tall (61 x 61 x 91-cm-tall, L x W x H) area. The entry may be smaller than this area, but it cannot be larger. The cookie construction must be presented, photographed, and videotaped against a solid single-color backdrop with no additional photo styling or staging.

Important: A 3-D cookie is **not** a flat cookie onto which royal icing has been pressure-piped or added as a transfer to create dimension. Likewise, a 3-D cookie is **not** a flat cookie onto which molded or modeled fondant (or some other decorating medium) has been added for dimension. Cookies of these descriptions should be placed in the 2-D Cookie category.

3-D Cookie Theme: Nature's Symphony

The theme is the same for both skill level classifications.

3-D Submission Materials

Again, all 3-D entries must conform to the general rules in the Competition Overview post on Cookie Connection to qualify for judging. All of the following items/materials are also required (unless noted as optional) and must be uploaded to the entry form on Cookie Connection. Submission materials are the same for both skill level classifications. Remember: Videos should not be professionally produced. A simple video taken on your mobile device will suffice as long as it shows all angles of your entry. With the exception of minor exposure adjustments, the photos and video you upload cannot be digitally altered in any way. In total, you will be required to submit 1 (360-degree view) video, 12 photos, short theme and technique/media descriptions, and a few other details. You will also have the option to upload 2 additional photos of your choice. Have these items completed and well organized before starting the entry process on Cookie Connection.

Important: Video and photos cannot exceed 100 MB each.



- 1. Entry title (Enter a short name for your entry that sums it up.)
- 2. Entrant's first and last name (Be sure to use the exact same name you used to register on Eventbrite. You may also need to add your name to the "Author" field in the entry area.)
- 3. Entrant's email address (Be sure to use the same email address you used to register on Eventbrite.)
- 4. Phone number (Be sure to use the same phone number you used to register on Eventbrite.)
- 5. Entry size (Indicate in inches the length, width, and height of your completed entry, excluding any inedible baseboard; if the baseboard is made of cookies, include it in your measurements. These measurements should correspond to what's shown in "Hero photo with measures" in Item #9, below.)
- 6. Number and size of cookies (Please indicate the total number of cookies in the entry, and the minimum and maximum sizes in inches.)
- 7. 360-degree video (This video should show judges the entirety of your entry, as if they were viewing it in person. Since pieces will be judged on their viewability from all angles, this video must show a full 360-degree view of the piece. Be sure to zoom in on any especially important or impressive details. Again, no filters or digital alterations are allowed.)
- 8. Hero photo (This photo should be your best view of the *front* of the entry.)
- 9. Hero photo with measures (This photo should be the same as the photo in Item #8, above, except that you should include rulers/tape measures alongside it to verify the size you noted in Item #5. Please use rulers/tape measures in inches.)
- 10. Right side view photo (This photo should be a view of the right side of your entry.)
- 11. Left side view photo (This photo should be a view of the left side of your entry.)
- 12. Back view photo (This photo should be a view of the back of your entry.)
- 13. Detail photo #1 (This photo should be a closeup of a particular area of your entry that you want the judges to see.)
- 14. Detail photo #2 (As above.)
- 15. Detail photo #3 (As above.)
- 16. Work-in-process photo #1 (Use this photo to show the number and size of cookies in your entry; it should correspond to the information you provided in Item #6. Again, to help judges verify sizes, include rulers/tape measures, in inches, in the photo.)
- 17. Work-in-process photo #2 (Use this photo to show your work at an intermediate stage of completion, and to highlight any unique techniques or media used. If you've used internal supports anywhere, they should also be revealed here.)



- 18. Work-in-process photo #3 (Again, use this photo to show your work at another stage of completion, and to highlight any unique techniques or media used.)
- 19. Work-in-process photo #4 (As above.)
- 20. OPTIONAL photo #1 (Your choice to upload, or not. If you upload a photo, be sure it presents something about your entry that you haven't yet shown to the judges.)
- 21. OPTIONAL photo #2 (Again, your choice to upload, or not.)
- 22. Description of theme interpretation (**No more than 300 words**. Please explain how you interpreted the theme and how it manifested itself in your 3-D entry.)
- 23. Description of techniques and media used (**No more than 600 words**. List all key media and cookie-shaping, decorating, *and* construction techniques used to create your entry. Be sure to highlight how cookie surfaces were covered, i.e., with royal icing, fondant, modeling chocolate, gumpaste, or another medium. *Remember*: Internal supports are discouraged, but allowed if clearly visible in your hero photo and easy for someone to remove if they were to eat the piece. And, any items that could be construed by judges as inedible including, but not limited to, pencil, luster dusts, and glitters should either not be used or be clearly identified by brand name in this area of the entry form so that judges can verify their edibility. Remember, "nontoxic" does not equate to "edible".)
